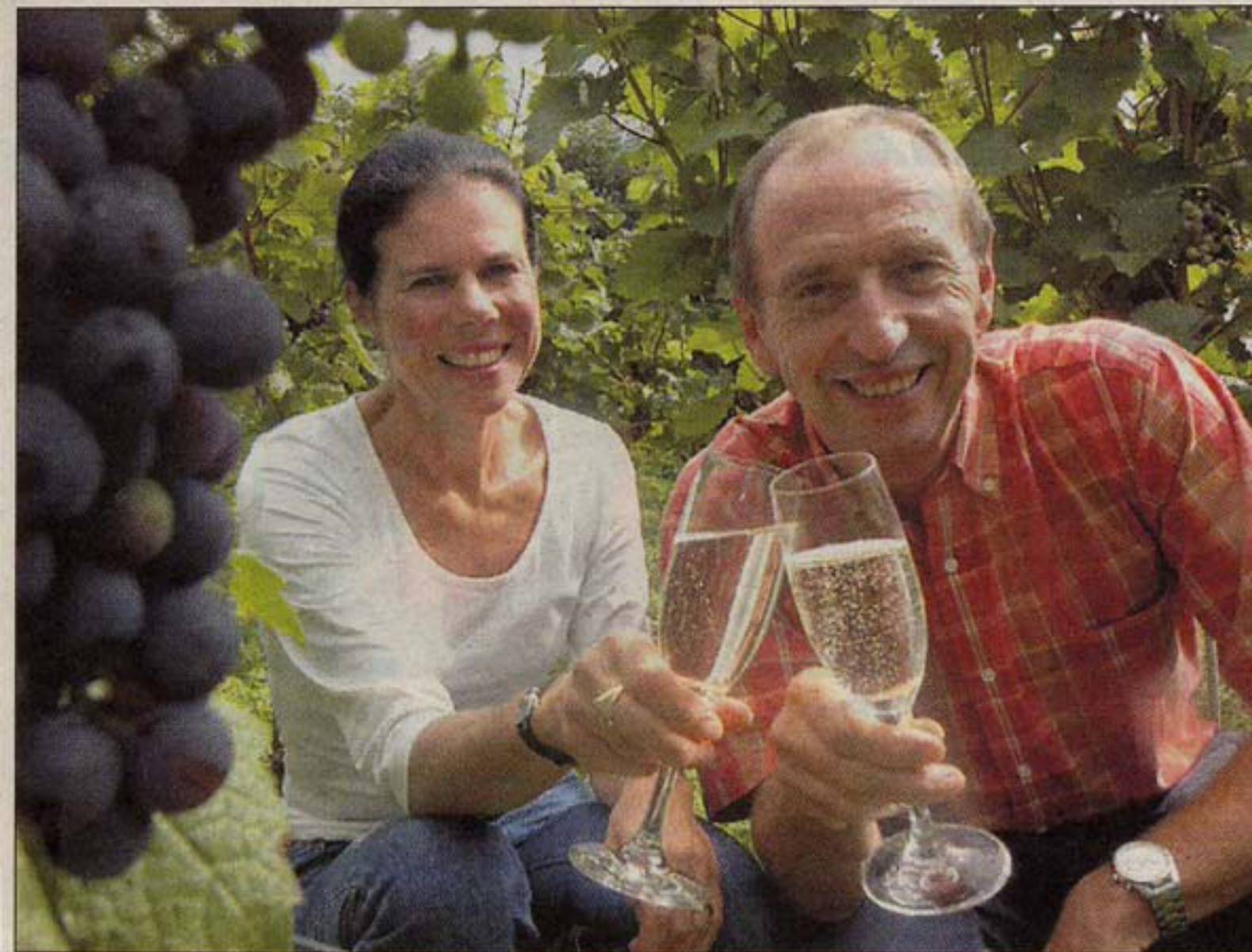

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## A Cornish fizzy that's the toast of Britain

A SPARKLING wine made in the UK has beaten off famous French brands to win a top award. Camel Valley Brut, produced in Cornwall, beat heavyweight names such as Moët and Chandon in a blind taste test at the International Wine Challenge Awards. Winemaker Bob Lindo was stunned by the achievement: 'We know we're up there near the top, but to get the only gold anywhere outside Champagne is amazing.' Earlier this week, in another victory for the British wine industry, Tesco's own Premier Cru was named the best non-vintage Champagne in the world.
